Asparagopsis in Action Bus Tour - 11th February 2025

Participants of the RFT Program (new intake open now) are welcome to join them for a day trip to Sea Forest, the production site for SeaFeed, starting in Launceston with pick up points in Perth and Campbell Town. On the bus, experts will deliver content - think of it as a travelling podcast with a Q&A session. SeaFeed processes the Tasmanian native asparagopsis seaweed into a supplement for cattle to prevent methane production. <u>Register here</u>.
